The Pharmacist's Role in Medical Aid-in Dying

The Death with Dignity Act (DWD) was enacted in Oregon in 1997. The Act allows eligible terminally ill patients to legally request medication to hasten death. Participating pharmacists have an integral role in providing information about medication regimens to physicians, patients and caregivers. This presentation will provide an overview of DWD, including medication challenges and practical aspects of pharmacist participation.

- Compare the medication regimens most commonly prescribed for medical aid-in-dying in Oregon.

Therapeutic Quick Topics

(1.5 Credit Hours Disease State Management/Drug Therapy)

We'll cover three "quick" therapeutic topics during this session, starting with diabetes management. This session will start with a quick overview of the most recent updates to the literature, practice standards, and communication strategies to help attendees develop more patient-specific treatment plans to help people live successfully with diabetes.

This session will then provide an overview of prophylactic therapy for patients with episodic migraine. Current guideline recommended prophylactic treatment options will be reviewed as well as expected treatment outcomes. The recently approved calcitonin gene-receptor peptide antagonists will also be discussed with a focus on efficacy, safety, and place in therapy.

We'll then conclude with an update on antimicrobial resistance. With antimicrobial resistance continuing to increase, limited antibacterials have come to market. Understanding the current state of resistance in community-acquired pathogens remains vital for optimal antibacterial selection. This talk will focus on the activity of new antibacterials approved in the past 5 years and highlight the continued treatment challenges for established and emerging resistant pathogens.

- Describe new agents approved and in the pipeline for type 1 and type 2 diabetes
- Discuss factors to consider when adding these new medications for specific patient populations

- Recognize the most effective (Level A) migraine prophylactic medications
- Define the efficacy of calcitonin gene-related peptide (CGRP) antagonists in terms of reduction in monthly migraine days
- List adverse effects of CGRP antagonists
- Compare the antibacterial activity of new antibiotics versus older antibiotics.
- Choose reasonable antibacterial therapy for selected common community pathogens.
- Identify new agents with activity against highly-resistant Gram negative pathogens.

Primary Care For Patients With HIV Infection

With long-term antiretroviral therapy (ART), fewer patients with HIV are dying from immunodeficiency-related illness. Most patients with HIV now live long enough to develop comorbidities of aging. 2019 Immunization Update

New vaccine approvals, coupled with new data from observational studies and clinical trials, has created additional options for the prevention and control of vaccine-preventable diseases. The Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) meets three times each year to review, vote upon, and approve immunization recommendations. Updates to immunization recommendations and recent outbreaks both serve as important reminders for keeping current with immunization practices. Pharmacists and other immunization providers have a responsibility to follow the guidelines and incorporate a best-practice approach when administering vaccines. This presentation provides an overview of the recent changes in vaccine recommendations and immunization practices.

Effectively Communicating with Patients Who Have Opioid Use Disorder

(1.0 Credit Hours General)

Opioid use disorder is an epidemic in the United States. Access to treatment and harm reduction techniques reduce morbidity and mortality in this patient population. Pharmacists are in a unique position to inform patients about treatment options and resources available to those that have substance use disorder. This session will teach concepts such as effective communication techniques and overcoming stigma which can be barriers to care and positive relationships with patients.

- Determine opioid misuse and be able to offer options for harm reduction
- Explain possible causes of frustration found among providers and patients
